F BARUTH Baruth, Philip E. The brothers Boswell : Soho Press, 2009

30th July, 1763. Two striking figures part the heaving crowd at London Bridge. Peddlers cease their haggling, ferrymen grow quiet, beggars stop and stare. Even the stink of the Thames seems to fade in the presence of Dr Samuel Johnson and James Boswell - history's most famous friends. Boswell, as charismatic and meticulously coiffed as Johnson is bullish and badly dressed, is eager to advance himself in literary society. Today he is to accompany the great Dr Johnson on an excursion up the Thames - and he is determined that nothing will go wrong. But another Boswell is watching from the shadows, insanely jealous of his elder brother's meteoric rise through London's coffeehouses and whorehouses, tenements and theaters, soirees and salons. He has two golden pistols in his pocket, a ferryboat at his disposal - and murder in his heart.

F BEAUFORT Beaufort, Simon. The bloodstained throne / Severn House, 2010

The new 'Sir Geoffrey Mappestone' mystery - When the former crusader knight Geoffrey Mappestone and his friend Roger of Durham try to slip out of England to the Holy Land, a ferocious storm destroys the ship they are on and casts them ashore. The two knights are unwillingly thrust into the company of other shipwrecked passengers, and while attempting to evade the unwelcome attention of the more dangerous members of the group, they become unwillingly drawn into a plot to overthrow the king and return England to Saxon rule.

F BENNETT Bennett, Alan. The laying on of hands : Picador USA, 2002

From the author of "The Clothes They Stood Up In" and one of Britain's most admired authors comes a stunning collection of three tales in one volume.

F BLOCK Block, Lawrence. A drop of the hard stuff : Mulholland Books/Little, Brown and Co., 2011

After a childhood friend is shot down while attempting to atone for past sins, Scudder is drawn into a murder investigation that threatens to upset his path toward recovery—and get him killed in the process.

F BROWN Brown, Dale, A time for patriots / William Morrow, 2011

When the nation's economy collapses and thousands of Americans turn against their own government, Patrick McLanahan must enlist the aid of his son and fellow citizens to hunt down terrorists any way they can.

F BROWN Brown, Rita Mae. Hiss of death : Bantam Books, 2011

Shortly before the 5K Run for Breast Cancer Awareness, Harry and her pets find the corpse of well-liked OR nurse Paula Benton, one of the event's organizers, who appears to have died of anaphylactic shock from a hornet's sting. But was it murder?

F BURKE Burke, James Lee, *The lost get-back boogie* / H. Holt, 1987

Trouble is brewing and Frank Riordan is the only one willing to stop it. As he wages a one-man campaign to shut down the local pulp mill that is polluting the air and devastating the environment, tensions are growing - and so is the level of power he's up against. It is becoming more than Frank can handle. The man who can help already has troubles of his own. Iry Paret is trying to put the past behind him, having served time for accidentally killing a man. He heads west to make a fresh start in Montana on Frank's ranch. But he hadn't expected to fall in love with the estranged wife of Frank's son, a strong, dynamic and beautiful woman who will test the limits of Iry's loyalty to his friends.

F BURTON Burton, Milton T. *Nights of the red moon* / Minotaur Books, 2010

Sequoia County, Texas sheriff Bo Handel has his hands full when the minister's wife is murdered. Launching an investigation, Bo soon finds himself chasing unfaithful attorneys, drug lords, and the town's usual suspects to find the killer. The case becomes more complicated when it's discovered that the dead woman was addicted to prescription drugs and being unfaithful with one of the roughest men in town.

F CLARK Clark, Marcia. *Guilt by association* : Mulholland Books/Little, Brown and Co., 2011

A Deputy DA specializing in high-profile cases, Rachel Knight is addicted to her work and fiercely loyal to her friends. But when her colleague Jake is found dead in a seedy Los Angeles hotel room next to the body of a teenage male prostitute, Rachel realizes she might not know those around her as well as she thinks.

F DAVIS-GARDNER Davis-Gardner, Angela. *Butterfly's child* : Dial Press, 2011

When three-year-old Benji is plucked from the security of his home in Nagasaki to live with his American father, Lt. Benjamin Franklin Pinkerton, and stepmother, Kate, on their farm in Illinois, the family conceals Benji's true identity as a child born from a liaison between an officer and a geisha. But when the truth about Benji surfaces, it will splinter this family's fragile dynamic, sending repercussions spiraling through their close-knit rural community and sending Benji on the journey of a lifetime.

F DEVERAUX Deveraux, Jude. *Carolina Isle* / Pocket Books, 2006

Ariel and Sara, lifelong look-alike pen pals, meet for the first time in their twenties and embark on the adventure of changing identities. Southern belle Ariel is determined to win the heart of a man who doesn't know she exists, while Sara yearns to leave behind her hardscrabble existence and taste the good life. But in Arundel, North Carolina, nothing is as it seems - including the dangers that are closing in on their new dream lives, as the deepest of fears and darkest of secrets and betrayals come to light.

F DOHERTY Doherty, P. C. Nightshade : Minotaur Books, 2011

January 1304 and Hugh Corbett, devoted emissary of King Edward I, has been charged with yet another dangerous mission: restore order to the village of Mistleham in Essex and return a Templar treasure to the King.

F DUNLAP Dunlap, Phil. Ambush Creek / Avalon Books, 2010

When U.S. Marshal Piedmont Kelly is asked by Cochise Sheriff John Henry Stevens to look into the suspicious activity of three unsavory bounty hunters, he rides into what looks like a battle's aftermath, with bullet holes riddling a ranch house, but no sign of those engaged in the gunplay. Kelly finds nothing to indicate that the mysterious rancher living there fit the description of the bounty hunters' quarry, either. Kelly sets out to locate the missing man. Enlisting the tracking skills of his old friend Spotted Dog -- the Chiricahua Apache whose life he once saved -- they follow four horses from the rancher's house all the way to Desert Belle, a dusty town that holds grim memories for Kelly. They ride straight into a deadly game where \$50,000, several lives, and the survival of the Gilded Lily mine are at stake.

F EGAN Egan, Greg, Zendegi / Night Shade Books, 2010

"In the near future, journalist Martin Seymour travels to Iran to cover the parliamentary elections. Most would-be opposition candidates are disqualified and the election becomes the non-event the world expects. But shortly afterward a compromising image of a government official captured on a mobile phone triggers a revolutionary movement that overthrows the old theocracy. Nasim Golestani, a young Iranian scientist living in exile in the United States, is hoping to work on the Human Connectome Project--which aims to construct a detailed map of the wiring of the human brain--but when government funding for the project is canceled and a chance comes to return to her homeland, she chooses to head back to Iran. Fifteen years after the revolution, Martin is living in Iran with his wife and young son, while Nasim is in charge of the virtual world known as Zendegi, used by millions of people for entertainment and business. When Zendegi comes under threat from powerful competitors, Nasim draws on her old skills, and data from the now-completed Human Connectome Project, to embark on a program to create more lifelike virtual characters and give the company an unbeatable edge. As controversy grows over the nature and rights of these software characters, tragedy strikes Martin's family. Martin turns to Nasim, seeking a solution that no one else can offer...but Zendegi is about to become a battlefield."--Dust cover flap.

F FANNING Fanning, Diane. Twisted reason : Severn House, 2010

When several patients with dementia, including her father-in-law, disappear and later turn up dead, Virginia homicide detective Lucinda Pierce conducts an investigation that leads her to a strange place resembling a poor man's Disneyland.

F FINCH Finch, Charles A stranger in Mayfair / Minotaur Books, 2010

Investigating the murder of a footman whose death is complicated by a false identity and unsettling facts about the victim's employers, Detective Lenox pursues a series of leads only to discover that an old friend may be involved.

F FREEMAN Freeman, Brian. The bone house / Minotaur Books, 2011

When 16-year-old Glory, Tresa Fischer's wild-child younger sister, turns up dead on a beach near Mark and Hilary's Florida hotel, Mark becomes the number one murder suspect. Det. Cab Bolton, who isn't one to jump to conclusions, travels from Florida to Wisconsin to unravel Mark--and Glory's--complicated lives.

F GARDNER Gardner, Lisa. Love you more : Bantam Books, 2011

Brian Darby lies dead on the kitchen floor. His wife, state police trooper Tessa Leoni, claims to have shot him in self-defense, and bears the bruises to back up her tale. For veteran detective D. D. Warren it should be an open-and-shut case. But where is their six-year-old daughter? As the homicide investigation ratchets into a frantic statewide search for a missing child, D. D. Warren must partner with former lover Bobby Dodge to break the case.

F GULLAND Gulland, Sandra. The last great dance on Earth / Scribner Paperback Fiction, 2006

The triumphant final volume of Gulland's beloved trilogy based on the life of Josephine Bonaparte...Josephine and Napoleon have been married four tumultuous years. Napoleon is Josephine's great love and she his. Their passionate union is troubled from within as Josephine is unable to produce an heir.

F GULLAND Gulland, Sandra. The many lives & secret sorrows of Josephine B. / Simon & Schuster, 1999

The diary of a Creole beauty from Martinique who became Napoleon's wife. It traces her adjustment to French high society, her love affairs in order to survive the revolution--her husband is guillotined--and her romance with Napoleon. First volume in a trilogy.

F HARROD-EAGLES Harrod-Eagles, Cynthia. Body line : Severn House, 2010

Rogers was handsome, charming, and rich-- until someone killed him in the hallway of his million-plus-pound house. Was he killed for passion, professional jealousy, or plain old money? Slider soon discovers that nothing is as it seems.

F HEL Hellenga, Robert, Snakewoman of Little Egypt : Bloomsbury, 2010

Anthropology professor Jackson Jones, 40, is contemplating what to do with the rest of his life when he meets Sunny, a newly released ex-con and former snake handler, looking for a place to live. He rents her his garage apartment and the unlikely pair becomes lovers, albeit pulled in different directions. Will their relationship survive when push comes to shove?

F HICKEY Hickey, Elizabeth, The wayward muse / Atria Books, 2007

With these words, the scandalous, wildly talented painter Dante Gabriel Rossetti changes seventeen-year-old Jane Burden's life forever. Jane's gaunt, awkward figure and grave expression have cemented her reputation as the ugliest girl in Oxford. Raised by a stableman on Holywell Street -- the town's most sordid and despicable

slum -- Jane is nearly resigned to marry in-kind. But when she meets Rossetti at the theater, he sees beyond her worn, ill-fitting dress and unruly hair and is stirred by her unconventional beauty. The charismatic painter whisks Jane into Oxford's exclusive art scene as his muse, and during the long and intimate hours of modeling -- draping and tilting, gazing and posing -- Jane finds herself falling in love. When Rossetti abruptly leaves Oxford with no plans to return, brokenhearted Jane settles for a stable, if passionless, marriage to his soft-spoken protege, William Morris -- the man who would go on to become the father of the British Arts and Crafts Movement. Jane resigns herself to life as a respectable wife and mother, exchanging the slop bucket for intricate needlepoint, willing away the memories of Rossetti and what could have been. But Rossetti and Jane are inextricably bound together by tragedy, art, and desire, and no amount of time or distance can separate them. Ultimately this complicated arrangement with which Jane, Morris, and Rossetti must learn to live threatens to undo them all. Richly textured and deftly portrayed, Elizabeth Hickey's latest is a compelling portrait of the ever-changing notions of both love and beauty.

F HUNT Hunt, Diann. For better or for worse / Thomas Nelson Publishers, 2007
She does weddings. He does divorces. Now they're in love . . . for better or for worse! Organizationally-challenged Wendy Hartline has her hands full running a wedding chapel, dealing with a rebellious daughter, a lovestruck son, and father who's lost his job and moved in with her. While the struggles distract her, one man steals her unsuspecting heart. A novel that shines a spotlight on the unique pleasures and pains of new love in midlife.

F JOHANSEN Johansen, Iris. Blind alley / Bantam Books, 2004
From the #1 "New York Times" bestselling author comes a new psychological thriller featuring forensics sculptor Eve Duncan, who becomes locked in a deadly duel with a killer who's determined to destroy her--one life at a time.

F JORDAN Jordan, Robert, Crossroads of twilight / Tor, 2003
The eagerly awaited 10th installment (after 2000's Winter's Heart) in Jordan's monumental Wheel of Time has all the breadth and depth that have made this fantasy author one of the acknowledged greats of the genre. Like Tolkien's Ring trilogy, Wheel of Time is a single, extended novel rather than a series, and in Crossroads, new characters join the cast and old favorites grow ever more complex. Here Mat Cauthon is still fleeing the Seanchan; Perrin Goldeneyes still hunts the Shaido to free his beautiful wife, Faile; the cities Caemlyn and Tar Valon are still besieged and the battles have not been joined.

F KELLERMAN Kellerman, Jonathan. Gone : Ballantine Books, 2007
Los Angeles is full of actors. For psychologist Alex Delaware, finding out what's real and what's not is about to become a matter of life and horrific death. Called in to evaluate an aspiring actress accused - along with her boyfriend - of staging her own abduction, Alex is indifferent when the case seems to go nowhere. But then the girl is savagely murdered, and suddenly a straightforward script takes a decidedly unexpected turn. Dylan Meserve, the victim's boyfriend, has also disappeared and the

caretaker at the couple's acting school has a history that makes him suspicious as well as weird. Is Dylan a deranged killer, or another victim? Alex and detective Milo Sturges begin auditioning suspects and trawling the depths of LA's seedy underbelly. Then more dead wannabes start turning up...

F KHEREMI Khemiri, Jonas Hassen, Montecore : Alfred A. Knopf, 2011

When his father's oldest friend, Kadir, emails Jonas to propose that they collaborate on a biography of Jonas' famous father, Jonas is reluctant-- he hasn't seen his father in nine years. Kadir's accounts of Abbas are admiring, Jonas' memories are critical and laced with irony and rage-- and we're given a portrayal of a man that is at once tender and feverishly imagined.

F LAMOUR L'Amour, Louis, The sixth shotgun / Leisure Books, 2005

Two of L'Amour's most exciting works are paired together in this one volume. Includes the title story, about a stagecoach robbery and frontier justice, and an original version of the short story "The Rider of Ruby Hills," one of L'Amour's greatest tales of range wars.

F LAMOUR L'Amour, Louis, Sitka / Penguin Group, 1985

Battle-hardened Jean LaBarge came of age on the American frontier, and is always in search of bold adventure. He'll find more than he bargains for in the rugged Alaskan territory, where he'll meet his match in Baron Zinnovy. Now he must defeat this savage, empire-hungry Russian to save his country's right to claim this frozen landscape and to win over the heart of the beautiful princess he loves!

F LUSTBADER Lustbader, Eric. Blood trust / Forge, 2011

Homeland Security agent Jack McClure sets out to save 23-year-old Alli Carson after she's accused of murdering her boyfriend. Meanwhile, Alli, who's training to be an FBI special ops agent, must escape from the clutches of her uncle, Henry Holt Carson, who has ties to a lengthy list of criminals engaged in dirty deeds ranging from a burgeoning trade in sex slaves to causing the recent financial meltdown in the U.S.

F MATTHIESSEN Matthiessen, Peter. At play in the fields of the Lord / Vintage Books, 1965 The timely story of the forces of change that converge on a small tribe of Niaruna Indians living in the heart of the Amazonian rain forest.

F MONNINGER Monninger, Joseph. Eternal on the water : Gallery Books, 2010

"From the day Cobb and Mary meet kayaking on Maine's Allagash River and fall deeply in love, the two approach life with the same sense of adventure they use to conquer the river's treacherous rapids. But rivers do not let go so easily, and neither does their love. So when Mary's life takes the cruelest turn, she vows to face those rough waters on her own terms and asks Cobb to promise, when the time comes, to help her return to their beloved river for one final journey."--p. [2] of jacket.

F MORSON Morson, Ian. Falconer and the death of kings / Severn House, 2010

Master William Falconer returns in this chilling and atmospheric medieval murder mystery. - Oxford, January 1273. When Regent Master William Falconer receives a cryptic message from Friar Roger, an old friend whose experimental scientific ideas the church consider heretical, he travels to Paris to find him. On arrival, he discovers his friend has been incarcerated in a friary, and he must work to ensure that his scientific theories are not lost forever. But, unbeknownst to Falconer, King Edward has a task for him - one that will test even the Regent Master's legendary powers of deduction.

F MOSLEY Mosley, Walter. The last days of Ptolemy Grey / Riverhead Books, 2010

Ptolemy Grey is a 91-year-old man, suffering from dementia and living as a recluse in his Los Angeles apartment. Then Robyn Small, a 17-year-old family friend, appears and helps clean up his apartment and straighten out his life. A reinvigorated Ptolemy volunteers for an experimental medical program that restores his mind, and he uses his last days--shortened now by the medical experiment--to delve into the mystery of the recent drive-by shooting death of his great-nephew, Reggie.

F PALMER Palmer, Diana. Blind promises / Steeple Hill, 2008

Her new patient, Gannon van der Vere, had run off his last four nurses. But, determined to live up to the strength of her name, Dana Steele refused to be intimidated. A powerful entrepreneur until a devastating accident left his future in doubt, Gannon raged at all who approached. Dana hoped to light a candle in his darkness and to escape from the shadows in her own past. But when she fell in love with her curmudgeonly employer, Dana's challenge was no longer strictly professional. Could prayer and persistence bring them both to a new dawn?

F PARKER Parker, I. J. The fires of the gods : Severn House, 2010

In 11th-century Japan, Sugawara Akitada's ailing wife is expecting a child, and when he loses his job and tries to confront the nobleman who is responsible for his dismissal, he ends up suspected of his murder. With no income and a growing family to support, Akitada desperately plunges into the investigation of this crime, aided by his faithful servant Tora, inadvertently placing not only his own life, but also the lives of his wife and child, in grave danger.

F PARKER Parker, Robert B., Sixkill / G. P. Putnam's Sons, 2011

When infamous actor Jumbo Nelson is accused of rape and murder, the Boston PD calls on Spenser to make heads or tails of the case. Although the evidence is mounting against Jumbo, Spenser makes a break when he teams up with Jumbo's bodyguard, Zebulon Sixkill, and uncovers some secrets involving the murder victim.

F PATTERSON Patterson, James, 10th anniversary / Little, Brown and Co., 2011

Detective Lindsay Boxer's long awaited wedding celebration becomes a distant memory when she is called to investigate a horrendous crime: a badly injured teenage girl is left for dead, and her newborn baby is nowhere to be found. Lindsay discovers that not only is there no trace of the criminals, but that the victim may be keeping

secrets as well. At the same time, Assistant District Attorney Yuki Castellano is prosecuting the biggest case of her life, a woman who has been accused of murdering her husband in front of her two young children. Yuki's career rests on a guilty verdict, so when Lindsay finds evidence that could save the defendant, she is forced to choose. Should she trust her best friend or follow her instinct? Lindsay's every move is watched by her new boss, Lieutenant Jackson Brady, and when the pressure to find the baby begins interfering with her new marriage to Joe, she wonders if she'll ever be able to start a family.

F PATTERSON Patterson, Richard North. The devil's light : Scribner, 2011

This book tells the story of an Al-Qaeda operative named Amer Al Zaroor, who, on orders from Osama Bin Laden, directs the theft of a nuclear weapon from the Pakistani military, and then transports it toward its intended target, Israel. Meanwhile Bin Laden announces to the world that he will make a major terrorist strike on 9/11/10, the tenth anniversary of 9/11. Deep inside Washington, Brooke Chandler, a CIA operative whose cover was blown by an incompetent colleague in Lebanon, thinks he knows how the bomb is being moved toward its target and how to find it. First he must overcome the skepticism of the CIA and the White House, and then he must find the bomb and disable or detonate it before it causes the Middle East to go up in flames.

F RICH Mystery Writers of America presents the rich and the dead / Grand Central Pub., 2011

Those with large amounts of money tend to do everything bigger than the rest of us. Sometimes, that includes breaking the law. This collection of stories centered on these people, edited by Nelson DeMille, includes the tale of a successful author who decides to concoct a scheme to murder his agent.

F SANDFORD Sandford, John, Buried prey / G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2011

Back in 1985, two girls disappeared, and fledgling cop Lucas Davenport couldn't get over it, even when his boss declared the case closed. Now a house has been torn down, the bodies of two girls wrapped in plastic have been found, and Davenport is back on the case.

F SHANNON Shannon, John, A little too much : Severn House, 2011

PI Jack Liffey is hired to find Ty Bird, a popular African-American actor. Bird is a schizophrenic and disappears from the set. He is off pursuing one of his hallucinations, looking for the father he never met. Jack's home life is falling apart. His daughter is at college and his partner, Gloria, is spending less time at home. Jack is feeling lonely. As Jack is searching for Bird, he discovers someone is coming to seek revenge.

F STEVENSON Stevenson, Laura Caroline, Return in kind / Separate Star Publishing, 2010

When Letty Hendrickson dies, she leaves an enormous bequest to Mather College - but to her husband Joel, she leaves 150 acres in Vermont that he didn't know she owned.

Joel goes to Vermont to sell the property, and discovers not a ski-country investment but the Ward Place: an old farm with a family graveyard and a house that is mysteriously clean and well-kept, in spite of having been empty since 1959. As Joel tries to solve the mystery of the bequest, he is assisted by three women. The first is Helena Woodhouse, who had a 45 year platonic friendship with Letty's guardian Nathaniel Brantford, the iconic president of Mather College from 1940 to 1977. The second is Charlotte (Charlie) Reynolds, a beautiful teenager whose eager research reveals the long-kept secrets of the Ward Place. And finally, first-hand understanding of the Vermont closed to outsiders is provided by Eleanor Randall Klimowski, a scholar who has been fired from her teaching job because of her increasing deafness, and who is now cleaning houses to support herself. What emerges is a tale of romance, misplaced pride, and unendurable sorrow - and Joel's realization that the bequest was a twisted but genuine act of love.

F THOMPSON Thompson, Victoria Murder on Bank Street : Berkley Prime Crime, 2009

Malloy takes up the unsolved murder of Dr. Brandt, but the shocking revelations he uncovers may destroy Sarah-- and Malloy's hope for any future with her.

F TUDISH Tudish, Catherine, American cream : Scribner, 2007

Writing with a perfectly pitched simplicity of prose ("San Francisco Chronicle"), Tudish follows the phenomenal success of her short stories with a beautifully rendered first novel about a woman rediscovering her home--and her heart.
