F ATHERTON Atherton, Nancy. *Aunt Dimity and the family tree* / Viking, 2011
Lori Shepherd's debonair father-in-law has moved to town and is renovating Fairworth House, a grand estate nearby. But once things get truly peculiar at Fairworth--moving furniture, strange sounds, and mysterious visitors--Lori calls on Aunt Dimity for her otherworldly guidance.

F AUDEL Auel, Jean M. *The land of painted caves* / Crown Publishing, 2011
Ayla struggles to find a balance between her duties as a new mother and her training to become a Zelandoni -- one of the Ninth Cave community's spiritual leaders and healers.

F BALOGH Balogh, Mary. *Irresistible* / Berkley Sensation, 1998
Sophie Armitage has never felt attractive to men. Even her late husband treated her more as a companion than a lover. But suddenly a longtime friendship turns into an irresistibly passionate affair.

F BLACK Black, Benjamin, *The silver swan* : Picador, 2008
This is the second Quirke novel from Man Booker prize-winning John Banville, writing as Benjamin Black. Time has moved on for Quirke, the world-weary Dublin pathologist first encountered in "Christine Falls". It is the middle of the 1950s, that low, dishonorable decade; a woman he loved has died, a man whom he once admired is dying, while the daughter he for so long denied is still finding it hard to accept him as her father. When Billy Hunt, an acquaintance from college days, approaches him about his wife's apparent suicide, Quirke recognizes trouble but, as always, trouble is something he cannot resist. Slowly he is drawn into a twilight world of drug addiction, sexual obsession, blackmail and murder, a world in which even the redoubtable Inspector Hackett can offer him few directions.

F BLACK Black, Benjamin, *Christine Falls* : Picador, 2006
This work is a compelling new crime series from the pen of Booker Prize winner John Banville. In the Pathology Department, it was always night. This was one of the things Quirke liked about his job...it was restful, cozy, one might almost say, down in these depths nearly two floors beneath the city's busy pavements. There was too a sense here of being part of the continuance of ancient practices, secret skills, of work too dark to be carried on up in the light. But one night, late after a party, Quirke stumbles across a body that shouldn't have been there...and his brother-in-law, eminent pediatrician Malachy Griffin - a rare sight in Quirke's gloomy domain - altering a file to cover up the corpse's cause of death. It is the first time Quirke encounters Christine Falls, but the investigation he decides to lead into the way she lived - and the reason she died - disturbs a dark secret that has been festering at the

core of Dublin's high Catholic society, a secret ready to destabilize the very heart and soul of Quirke's own family.

F BLACK Black, Lisa, Takeover / William Morrow, 2008

What initially appears to be a bank heist turns into something far more complex and deadly. When forensic scientist Theresa MacLean seizes the opportunity to trade places with the city's best hostage negotiator, she must decide what she is willing to sacrifice in order to save the lives of innocent people as well as her own.

F BOSTWICK Bostwick, Marie. A thread of truth / Kensington Books, 2009

At twenty-seven, fleeing an abusive marriage with little more than her kids and the clothes on her back, Ivy Peterman figures she has nowhere to go but up. Quaint, historic New Bern, Connecticut, seems as good a place as any to start fresh. With a part-time job at the Cobbled Court Quilt Shop and budding friendships, Ivy feels hopeful for the first time in ages. But when a popular quilting TV show is taped at the quilt shop, Ivy's unwitting appearance in an on-air promo alerts her ex-husband to her whereabouts. Suddenly, Ivy is facing the fight of her life--one that forces her to face her deepest fears as a woman and a mother. This time, however, she's got a sisterhood behind her: companions as complex, strong, and lasting as the quilts they stitch.

F BOSTWICK Bostwick, Marie. A thread so thin / Kensington, 2010

While New Bern, Connecticut, lies under a blanket of snow, the Cobbled Court Quilt Shop remains a cozy haven for its owner, Evelyn Dixon, and her friends. But when Evelyn's son Garrett rolls out the red carpet for a super-romantic New Year's Eve--complete with marriage proposal--for Liza, the young woman finds herself torn between a rare career opportunity and love for Garrett.

F BRANDON Brandon, John Citrus County / McSweeney's], 2010

Toby and Shelby are not like the other kids. Fifteen years old and marooned in sleepy Citrus County, Florida, they stand apart from the cliques of jocks and cheerleaders. Toby is a troubled, unloved boy with a criminal record. Shelby is the fiercely intelligent girl who is uncontrollably attracted to him. As their relationship intensifies one sticky, hot summer, a spur-of-the-moment act will come to change their lives forever.

F BRAUN Braun, Lilian Jackson. The cat who had 14 tales Jove Books, 1988

A courageous Siamese bags a cunning cat burglar. A country kitty proves a stumbling block in a violent murder. And an intuitive feline's premonition helps solve the case of the missing antique dealer. Here are 14 Braun "Cat" tales that are riveting and amusing whodunits.

F BRAUN Braun, Lilian Jackson. The cat who saw red / Berkley, 1986

After moving into an old mansion whose previous owner committed suicide, prize-winning reporter Qwilleran and his two Siamese cats are disturbed by strange occurrences and start to investigate when Qwilleran's old girlfriend disappears.

F BRAUNBECK Braunbeck, Gary A. Coffin county / Dorchester ; | Publishers Group UK [distributor], 2008

Set in and near Cedar Hill, Ohio, the novel is a pell-mell gore fest, whose supernatural perps leak from an alternate reality that interfaces with Cedar Hill.

F BROCKMAN Brockmann, Suzanne. Breaking the rules : Ballantine Books, 2011

Navy SEAL Izzy Zanella and his estranged wife, Eden Gillman, are set on saving her brother even if that means reconciling with each other to prove to a court that they can give better care to the young teenage boy. Just as their hearts begin to mend, the makeshift family gets caught up in saving another youth from a crime ring in Las Vegas and ends up with a group of dangerous men on their trail.

F BROWN Brown, Eleanor, The weird sisters / Amy Einhorn Books/G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2011

The Andreas family loves reading. In fact, the father, a Shakespeare professor, has named his three daughters after Shakespearean women. When the girls return home to care for their ailing mother, they discover that the other sisters are there too, which doesn't make any of them happy. They love each other. They just don't like each other very much.

F BROWN Brown, Rita Mae. The tail of the tip-off Bantam Books, 2003

It's dead cold in Crozet, Virginia, but the college basketball season is heating up. In their 11th outing, Mary Minor "Harry" Haristeen and her sleuthing pets investigate the suspicious death of a well-liked local builder.

F BURTON Burton, Mary Senseless / Zebra Books : | Kensington Publishing Corp., 2011

A vicious serial killer loves to make his female victims suffer by branding a star on them before stabbing them through the heart. Every victim is linked to Eva Rayburn, and the predator won't stop what he started ten year's earlier at a sorority party until she is dead. Can Eva and Det. Deacon Garrison find the killer before she becomes the final victim?

F CAMERON Cameron, Bill, Day One / Tyrus Books, 2010

Three lives converge at a bloody stand-off : Ellie Spaneker, who flees her home and abusive husband only to be dogged by a brutal ex-cop hired by her father-in-Law, retired homicide detective Skin Kadash, who is searching for a witness in a unsolved murder, and Eager, a homeless grifter.

F CHILDS Childs, Laura. Bedeviled eggs / Berkley Prime Crime, 2010

It is Halloween time and Suzanne and the ladies of the Cackleberry Club cafe are getting the place decorated and filled with goodies. But when a mayoral candidate gets killed by an arrow while leaving the cafe, it seems the tricks are coming before the treats. After a historical society member is also found dead, it is up to Suzanne to stop the killing spree. 'Cackleberry Club Mystery.'

F CHILDS Childs, Laura. Scones & bones / Berkley Prime Crime, 2011

Indigo Tea Shop owner Theodosia Browning is lured into attending the Heritage Society's "Pirates and Plunder" soiree. But it's an antique diamond skull ring that gets plundered by someone who murders a history intern in the process. Theodosia knows she'll have to whet her investigative skills to find the killer among a raft of suspects.

F CLARK Clark, Mary Higgins. Mount Vernon love story : Simon & Schuster, 2002

Charming, insightful, and immensely entertaining in its unique presentation of one of America's legendary figures, this first novel by Mary Higgins Clark--originally published as "Aspire to the Heavens"--shows the reader the man behind the legend, a man of flesh, blood, and passion.

F CLARK Clark, Mary Higgins. Just take my heart / Simon & Schuster, 2009

Emily Wallace, an attractive thirty-two-year-old assistant prosecutor and heart-transplant recipient, is given a plum assignment--the murder trial of theatrical agent Gregg Aldrich, accused of murdering his wife. During the trial, Emily experiences sentiments that defy all reason and continue after Gregg Aldrich's fate is decided by the jury. In the meantime, she does not realize that her own life is now at risk.

F COBEN Coben, Harlan, Live wire / Dutton, 2011

When a pregnant tennis star reports that her rock-artist husband has gone missing amid scandalous rumors, Myron Bolitar is forced to confront deep secrets about his client's past while struggling with fatherhood roles in his personal life.

F CRAIS Crais, Robert. The sentry / G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2011

Five years after Dru Rayne and her uncle fled Hurricane Katrina they face another danger in L.A. which Joe Pike and his partner Elvis Cole get drawn into. Pike and Elvis' investigation soon reveals that Dru and her uncle are not who they seem and that a vengeful, murderous force from their past is catching up to them.

F CUSSLER Cussler, Clive. The jungle : G. P. Putnam's Sons, 2011

To pull off their latest mission, Cabrillo and the crew of the Oregon must survive a devastating new weapon unleashed in thirteenth-century China ... a daring rescue in the snowbound mountains along the Afghanistan-Pakistan border ... a woman gone missing in the jungles of northern Thailand and Myanmar ... for Cabrillo and company, all of these events will come together -- leading to the greatest threat against US security that the country has ever known.

F DEVERAUX Deveraux, Jude. The Scent of Jasmine : Pocket Books , 2011

Charleston, 1799: A daughter of Southern gentility and a gifted painter, Catherine Edilean Harcourt has no lack of suitors at home in Virginia, waiting to fulfill her dream of marriage and family. But Cay's adventurous spirit, fostered by growing up with her three brothers, is piqued while visiting her godfather in South Carolina. Bedridden with a broken leg, he asks Cay to fill in for him on an urgent task: on her way to a fancy dress ball, she must deliver a packed horse to an old friend's son--who also

happens to be an escaped convict charged with murdering his wife! Cay agrees to the plan, which doesn't go at all as planned, whereupon she finds herself fleeing Alexander McDowell's captors, riding blind into the night with the fugitive Scotsman. Though she should fear him, Cay finds herself overwhelmingly attracted to Alex, and drawn into his tale of misguided justice and his innocence as they seek refuge in the steamy Florida everglades. Will trusting him be the worst mistake of her life? Or will falling in love be the salvation both of them have been looking for?

F DODD Dodd, Christina. Danger in a red dress / Signet, 2009

When her employer, a wealthy elderly woman on her death bed, entrusts her with a dangerous secret, Hannah Grey, forced to go on the run and pursued by killers, desperately searches for the one man who can keep her alive.

F DUNANT Dunant, Sarah. Sacred hearts : Random House Trade Paperbacks, 2010

The year is 1570, and in the convent of Santa Caterina, in the Italian city of Ferrara, noblewomen find space to pursue their lives under God's protection. But any community, however smoothly run, suffers tremors when it takes in someone by force. And the arrival of Santa Caterina's new novice sets in motion a chain of events that will shake the convent to its core.

F EDWARDS Edwards, Kim, The lake of dreams / Viking, 2011

The story of a woman's homecoming, a family secret, and the old house that holds the key to the true legacy of a family. At a crossroads in her life, Lucy Jarrett returns home from Japan, only to find herself haunted by her father's unresolved death a decade ago. Old longings stirred up by Keegan Fall, a local glass artist who was once her passionate first love, lead her into the unexpected. Late one night, as she paces the hallways of her family's rambling lakeside house, she discovers, locked in a window seat, a collection of objects that first appear to be useless curiosities. But soon they reveal a deeper and more complex family past. As Lucy discovers and explores the traces of her lineage from an heirloom tapestry and dusty political tracts to a web of allusions depicted in stained glass windows throughout upstate New York, the family story she has always known is shattered. Lucy's quest for the truth reconfigures her family's history, links her to a unique slice of the suffragette movement, and yields dramatic insights that embolden her to live freely. With surprises at every turn, this is a saga in which every element emerges as a carefully placed piece of the puzzle.

F FEEHAN Feehan, Christine. Water bound / Jove Books, 2010

When he is rescued from a freezing black eddy by a beautiful woman named Rikki, Lev Prakenskii, who has no memory of who he is or why he possesses the instincts of a trained killer, fears for his life and the life of his savior.

F FERRIS Ferris, Monica. Buttons and bones / Berkley Prime Crime, 2010

While renovating a cabin in the Minnesota woods, Betsy Devonshire, owner of the Crewel World needlework shop, discovers the skeleton of a Nazi. Her investigation

yields the site of a former German POW camp and an intricately designed pattern of clues to a decades-old crime.

F FLUKE Gingerbread cookie murder / Kensington Books, 2010

Hannah Swensen of the Cookie Jar in Lake Eden, Minn., discovers her neighbor's head bashed in; Jane Austen's holiday stay at her parents' home in the Tampa Vistas retirement community is enlivened by the murder of an elderly lothario; and, Maine reporter Lucy Stone investigates a four-year-old boy's disappearance. Includes recipes.

F FLYNN Flynn, Vince. American assassin : Atria Books, 2010

Mitch Rapp, an operative with the CIA-supported counterterrorism unit the Onion Team, takes on his first assignment.

F FOLLETT Follett, Ken. Fall of giants / Dutton, 2010

Follows the fates of five interrelated families--American, German, Russian, English, and Welsh--as they move through the dramas of the First World War, the Russian Revolution, and the struggle for women's suffrage.

F FOSTER Foster, Lori, Simon says / Berkley Books, 2007

Sexy ex-fighter Simon Evans has the perfect life-until he catches his girlfriend cheating. To work off his rage, he goes back into the ring full-force. But a gutsy and gorgeous P.I. is about to send him reeling with a secret about his family--and one about her heart.

F FRANCIS Francis, Dick. Odds against. Fawcett Crest 1965

Sid Halley, champion jockey, had to give up racing when his hand was smashed. But his next job brings him a bullet - right in the middle of his chest. As he would soon discover, life as a private eye could get a lot worse, especially when a ruthless property dealer has plans for Seabury racetrack. Plans that have nothing to do with racing and everything to do with conspiracy and violence. The kind of plans that set high odds against a novice detective staying alive... 'A plot that goes with the pace of a champion hurdler' - "Evening Standard".

F FRANCK Franck, Julia. The blindness of the heart / Grove Press ; | Distributed by Publishers Group West, 2009

A multi-generational family story set in the Germany of the early twentieth century that reveals the devastating effect of war on the human heart.

F FUENTES Fuentes, Carlos. Destiny and desire : Random House, 2011

The severed head of Josue Nadal, floating in the Pacific Ocean off the shore of Mexico, remembers his life, his friends, enemies, and lovers, and his involvement in the drug trade and the corruption frequently encountered in his country.

F GABRIEL Gabriel, Sarah. Stealing Sophie / Avon Books, 2005

Connor MacPherson has no need for a bride, but this Highland laird is determined to honor a promise. He snatches the bonny MacCarran lass, only to discover too late that he has the wrong sister!

F GARDNER Gardner, Lisa. The other daughter / Bantam Books, 1999

Twenty years ago, Melanie Stokes was abandoned in a Boston hospital, then adopted by a wealthy young couple. Gifted with loving parents, a doting brother and indulgent uncle, Melanie has always considered herself lucky. Until tonight. Tonight, a has-been reporter turns up investigating her past. Tonight, the first note arrives saying, "You Get What You Deserve." And tonight, Melanie has her first, horrifying vision of the past. Melanie has no memory of her life before the adoption. Now, someone wants to give it back, even if it includes the darkest nightmare the Stokes family ever faced: the murder of their first daughter in Texas. F GIBSON Gibson, Rachel. True confessions / Avon Books, 2001

L.A. based tabloid reporter Hope Spencer has come to Gospel hoping for inspiration. Well, she gets inspiration...Hope has never met anyone quite like the residents of Gospel. From the Dean sisters with their color-coordinated hair to the toilet-tossing sportsmen...to the murder victim whose body had been found in her house years before. She discovers that reality is stranger than fiction -- even tabloid fiction!

F GONZALEZ Gonzalez, J. F., Shapeshifter / Leisure Books/Dorchester Publishing Company, 2008

Forced by a wealthy, powerful man to do his bidding, Mark Wiseman, who does not want his secret to get out, must use his curse to kill, but when he begins to lose control over the wolf within him, things take a terrifying turn.

F GORDON Gordon, Jaimy, Lord of misrule : McPherson & Co., 2010

At the rock-bottom end of the sport of kings sits the ruthless and often violent world of cheap horse racing, where trainers and jockeys, grooms and hotwalkers, loan sharks and touts all struggle to take an edge, or prove their luck, or just survive. Equal parts Nathanael West, Damon Runyon and Eudora Welty, Lord of Misrule follows five characters, scarred and lonely dreamers in the American grain, through a year and four races at Indian Mount Downs, downriver from Wheeling, West Virginia.--P. F GREGORY Gregory, Philippa. The wise woman / Simon & Schuster, 1992

Set in the Pennines at the time of the Tudor Reformation, the story tells of a young nun called Alys, who must choose between the ancient magic that can bring her the man she desires, or the Christian faith that binds her to her sisters in Christ.

F GRISSOM Grissom, Kathleen. The kitchen house / Simon & Schuster, 2010

"Gone with the Wind" is turned inside out in this tragic, page-turning novel in which a white indentured servant girl lives and works with black slaves.

F HAMILTON Hamilton, Laurell K. Nightseer / Penguin Books, 1992

Laurell K. Hamilton has brought the supernatural to light-and has given readers a vision of a world aflame with electrifying suspense and violent passions. In this, her debut novel, her rich imagination spreads its wings to fly-in a tale of a woman known as sorcerer, prophet, and enchantress.

F HART Hart, Carolyn G. Death walked in / William Morrow, 2008

Annie and Max Darling are pulled into a murder investigation when the previous owner of the house they are restoring is found dead and they learn the killer believes that hidden inside the Darling's home is a fortune in gold coins.

F HAWKES Hawkes, John, Sweet William : Penguin Books, 1993

From the National Book Award winner comes the moving novel of Sweet William, an old thoroughbred horse, who recounts the trials and tribulations of his life. Sweet William shares the glory of his days as a race horse--and as a broken-down mount transformed by the kindness of a strange old man.

F HUFF Huff, Tanya. Blood price / DAW Books, 1991

It began with blood and death. And Vicki Nelson, PI was at the scene. The victim had been brutally, inhumanly opened up. Messy work. She'd had to cover the corpse with her coat. It had sort of made her feel involved. Now Vicki is caught up in the deadly pursuit of a mass murderer with an inhuman appetite for mayhem and destruction. And her advisor on the case is doing nothing to dampen her growing sense of foreboding. But then, with a being of unspeakable evil stalking the city, only Vicki Nelson would ally herself to Henry Fitzroy, the illegitimate child of Henry VIII and a five-hundred-year-old vampire.

F HUNTER Hunter, Madeline. The sins of Lord Easterbrook / Bantam Dell, 2009

"Only a desperate mission could bring Leona Montgomery face-to-face with the scoundrel whose dangerous sensuality once sent her fleeing from his arms. But she has underestimated Christian, Marques of Easterbrook. As irresistible as ever, his past swathed in mystery, Christian has his own plans for the woman he has waited seven years to claim. Yet once desire reignites, bringing a dangerous secret into the open, Leona will find herself bound to the seductive nobleman in ways she could never have imagined. F HURWITZ Hurwitz, Gregg Andrew. Do no harm / Morrow, 2002

Someone is stalking the UCLA Medical Center -- a depraved madman who is preying upon the staff, particularly those who are young and female. E.R. Chief Dr. David

Spier must keep the emergency room running smoothly and efficiently, even as his terrified co-workers wonder who will be the next victim.

F JAMES James, Henry, *The wings of the dove* / Hyperion, 1997

When Milly Theale travels to London she meets Kate Croy, and is introduced to her love, Merton Densher. Kate is facing an impossible choice - either marry the man she loves, or give him up in order to take her rightful place in society.

F JAMES James, Peter, *Dead like you* / Minotaur Books, 2010

The brutal rapes of two women in Brighton bear remarkable similarities to an unsolved series of crimes from 1997. Detective Superintendent Roy Grace is forced to delve into his shattered past to find the key to unlocking the current mystery.

F JANCE Jance, Judith A. *Fatal error* / Simon & Schuster, 2011

When Brenda Riley, a colleague from Ali's old news broadcasting days in California, shows up in town with an alcohol problem and an unlikely story about a missing fiancé, Ali reluctantly agrees to help. The man posing as Brenda's fiancé is revealed to be Richard Lowensdale, a cyber-sociopath who has left a trail of broken hearts in his virtual wake. When he is viciously murdered, the police soon focus their investigation on Brenda.

F KAMENSKY Kamensky, Jane. *Blindspot* : Spiegel & Grau, 2008

In Boston in 1764, the sudden death of revolutionary leader Samuel Bradstreet causes Scottish portrait painter Stewart Jameson and his apprentice Francis Weston, to search for the truth. Jameson is a Scottish portrait painter who, having fled his debtors in Edinburgh, has washed up on America's far shores. Eager to begin anew in this new world, he advertises for an apprentice, but the lad who comes knocking is no lad at all. Fanny Easton is a lady in disguise, a young, fallen woman from Boston's most prominent family; she becomes Jameson's defiant and seductive apprentice, Francis Weston. Liberty is what everyone's seeking in boisterous, rebellious Boston on the eve of the American Revolution. But everyone suffers from a kind of blind spot, too. Jameson, distracted by his haunted past, can't see that Fanny is a woman; Fanny, consumed with her own masquerade, can't tell that Jameson is falling in love with her. The city's Sons of Liberty can't quite see their way clear, either. "Aby do they see the shackles Parliament fastens about them," Jameson writes, "but to the fetters they clasp upon their own slaves, they are strangely blind."

F KAUFFMAN Kauffman, Donna. *The black sheep and the princess* / Brava/Kensington Pub. Corp., 2007

Bad boy Donovan MacLeod, illegitimate son of the drunken handyman, returns to the Catskills camp where he was scorned as a teenager to find out why Kate Sutherland is giving up her mother's inheritance to turn the place into a camp for disabled children. Kate is getting the cold shoulder in town when she seeks workers to rehab the camp and law enforcement officials to find out who is vandalizing it. Donovan once lusted after Kate, and she after him, but neither acknowledged their feelings. Now he

volunteers himself and his organization, Trinity, to help her, knowing that his NYPD experience is more than adequate preparation for the job.

F KELLERMAN Kellerman, Jonathan. *Mystery* : Ballantine Books, 2011

Psychologist Alex Delaware and his girlfriend Robin are making a farewell visit to an LA hotel bar when one patron in particular grabs their attention -- a beautiful but aloof young woman dressed all in white. Two days later, Alex is called in on a murder case and is shocked when he recognizes the victim as the woman in white.

F KING King, Stephen, *Black house* : Random House, 2001

Two of the greatest storytellers of our time join forces to create an epic thriller of unsurpassed power; a twisting, compelling story of a small American town held in the grip of evil beyond all reason. French Landing, Wisconsin. A comfortable, solid middle-American town inhabited by comfortable, solid middle-Americans! and a serial killer. Three children have been lost -- taken by a monster with a taste for child's flesh nicknamed 'The Fisherman' after a legendary murderer. It's all way beyond the experience of the local police, whose only hope lies with ex-detective Jack Sawyer, the man who cracked their last case for them. But, plagued by visions of another world, Jack has retired to this rural retreat precisely to avoid such horrors -- and, having recognized the touch of madness on this case, he's keeping well away. Soon, he'll have no choice. Young Tyler Marshall, left behind one afternoon by his bullying friends, pedals past the local old folks' home and is accosted by a crow. 'Gorg,' it caws, and 'Ty.' What ten-year-old could resist a bird that speaks his name? Not Ty, that's for sure. And as he follows the mysterious crow, he's grabbed by the neck and dragged into a hedge. The Fisherman has made another catch!

Saers The Sixty-Five Years of Washington is simultaneously a brilliant comedy about memory, narrative, time, and death and a moving narrative about the lost generations of an Argentina that was perpetually on the verge of collapse.

F SANDFORD Sandford, John, Rules of prey / Berkley, 2005

In this novel an intelligent serial killer is at large, a member of the bar who has derived rules for his murders based on professional examination of actual cases. His opponent is Lucas Davenport, a policeman, who quickly realizes that this is no ordinary killer.

F SANDS Sands, Lynsay. Love bites / Love Spell, 2004

Etienne Argeneau's three hundred years of bachelorhood are at an end. He can only "turn" one human in his lifetime, and most of his kind reserved that power for creating a life mate. He has to save Rachel Garrett. He doesn't know her very well, but the beautiful coroner had saved his life. To save hers he would make her immortal. Rachel Garrett awakes surprised. All she'd wanted was to get off the night shift at the morgue; now here she is staggering to her feet naked and in a strange place. Then she sees the man of her dreams emerging from his...coffin? She just hopes he tastes as good as he looks.

F SANDS Sands, Lynsay. Tall, dark & hungry / Love Spell, 2004

It bites: New York hotels cost an arm and a leg, and Terri has flown from England to help plan her cousin's wedding. The new in-laws offered lodging. But they're a weird bunch -- and it isn't just that they're Canadian! There is the sometimes-chipper-

sometimes-silent Lucern, and the wacky stage-actor Vincent: she can't imagine Broadway casting a hungrier singing-and-dancing Dracula. And then there is Bastien. Just looking into his eyes, Terri has to admit she's falling for someone even taller, darker, and hungrier. She's feeling a mite peckish herself. And if she stays with him, those bloodsucking hotel owners won't get her!

F SANDS Sands, Lynsay. Single white vampire / Love Spell, 2003

"SWM -- Successful biographer of family; books recently categorized as ""paranormal romances."" Doesn't like sunbathing, garlicky dinners or religious symbols.
