F ALBERT Albert, Susan Wittig. *Mourning Gloria* / Berkley Prime Crime, 2011
After a woman is killed in an arson-homicide, Jessica Nelson, an intern-reporter at the local paper, is assigned to cover the story. When Jessica disappears, China Bayles is determined to find her, before she becomes a headline herself.

F ALLEN Allen, Sarah Addison. *The peach keeper* : Bantam Books, 2011
Willa Jackson of Walls of Water, North Carolina, has lately learned that an old classmate—socialite do-gooder Paxton Osgood—of the very prominent Osgood family, has restored her family’s Blue Ridge Mountain home to its former glory, with plans to open a top-flight inn. But when a skeleton, found buried beneath the lone peach tree on the property is found, Willa and Paxton must confront the dangerous passions and tragic betrayals that once bound their families.

F APPANAH Appanah-Mouriquand, Nathacha, *The last brother* / Graywolf, 2011
“As 1944 comes to a close, nine-year-old Raj is unaware of the war devastating the rest of the world. He lives in Mauritius, a remote island in the Indian Ocean, where survival is a daily struggle for his family. After a brutal beating lands Raj in the hospital of a prison camp, he meets David, a boy his own age. David is a refugee, one of a group of Jewish exiles now indefinitely detained in Mauritius. When a massive storm on the island brings chaos and confusion to the camp, Raj is determined to help David escape.”—P. [4] of cover.

F ARCHER Archer, Jeffrey, *And thereby hangs a tale* / St. Martin’s Press, 2010
Fifteen short pieces are set in various world regions and include “Members Only,” in which a young man’s life is transformed by a Christmas cracker.

F BAKER Baker, Jeanette. *Chesapeake summer*, 2007
Bailey Jones has always been a misfit in a town that sets a lot of store on family lineage, old money, and homes that overlook the Chesapeake. As he makes plans to leave Marshy Hope Creek for good, a couple of things delay his departure. A developer unearths a long-dead homicide victim on land that was his up until a few weeks ago. And Chloe Richards is back in town. The first piece of startling news sends a shiver down the spines of four of the town’s most prominent citizens. Each of them has something from their past that could connect them to this discovery with dire consequences. And the second piece of news sends a shiver down Bailey’s back—a not unpleasant experience. As the gossip mill kicks into overdrive, an air of expectation settles over the town. It will be a long, hot summer.

F BALDACCI Baldacci, David. *The sixth man* / Grand Central Pub., 2011
After alleged serial killer Edgar Roy is apprehended and locked away in a psychiatric unit, private investigators Sean King and Michelle Maxwell are called in by Roy’s

lawyer—an old friend of Sean King—to look into the case. But en route to their first meeting with the lawyer, King and Maxwell discover his dead body.

F BALL Ball, Toby. *The vaults* / St. Martin's Press, 2010

In a dystopian 1930s America, a chilling series of events leads three men down a path to uncover their city's darkest secret. A mysterious duplicate file is discovered deep within the Vaults, and their investigations call into question whether their most basic beliefs can be maintained in a climate of overwhelming corruption and conspiracy.

F BANKS Banks, Iain, *Surface detail* / Orbit, 2010

When sex slave Lededje Y'breq is murdered by a politician on the planet Sichult, the artificial intelligence running one of the Culture's immense starships resurrects her so she can seek revenge. Meanwhile, the Culture is uneasily watching the conflict over whether to preserve virtual Hells for the souls of "sinners" or give them the release of death.

F BARRON Barron, Stephanie. *Jane and the madness of Lord Byron* : Bantam Books, 2010

Not long after arriving at the English resort of Brighton, Jane finds herself caught up in the town's turmoil when the body of a beautiful young society miss is discovered, lifeless, in the bedchamber of none other than George Gordon—otherwise known as Lord Byron.

F BAXTER Baxter, Cynthia. *Murder packs a suitcase* / Bantam Books, 2008

"Mallory Marlowe is ready to turn a corner—one lined with palm trees, plastic pink flamingo lawn ornaments, and snack bars shaped like giant ice cream cones. Thanks to her new job as travel writer for the New York magazine *The Good Life*, recently widowed Mallory is zipping around Orlando, assigned to rediscover the glory days of 'old Florida.' It's the first of what she hopes will be many exciting adventures, but she's about to discover that the Sunshine State has a dark side. Settled in among the faux volcanoes and tiki torches of the Polynesian Princess Hotel, Mallory is on the lookout for quirky attractions like alligator farms and pirate-themed diners hidden amid the glitzy theme parks. But she's not prepared to find a cranky journalist speared to death in the Bali Ballroom—or to find herself a suspect in his murder. With her trip coming to a close, Mallory has no choice but to figure out if one of her fellow travel writers is a killer. Because if she doesn't get out of Florida soon, her career—and her life—are about to come to a dead end"—p. [4] of cover.

F BEAR Bear, Elizabeth. *The sea thy mistress* / Tor, 2011

Beautiful Cathair, now an immortal warrior angel, has been called back to the city of Eiledon to raise his son—Muire's son as well—cast up on shore as an infant. It is seemingly a quiet life. But deadly danger approaches: the evil goddess Heythe, who engineered the death of Valdyrgard, has travelled forward in time on her rainbow steed seeking revenge.

F BEAR Bear, Greg, *Hull zero three* / Orbit, 2010

A starship hurtles through the emptiness of space, its destination-unknown and **its** purpose-a mystery. One man wakes up wet, naked, and freezing to death. The dark halls are full of monsters but trusting other survivors he meets might be the greater danger. All he has are questions—Who is he? Where are they going? What happened to the dream of a new life? What happened to the woman he loved? What happened to Hull 03?

F BECKER Becker, James. *The Messiah secret / Signet Select/New American Library*, 2010

Assessing the contents of a lavish English estate, museum conservator Angela Lewis discovers a crate full of sealed pottery jars—one of which holds a parchment which describes the life and times of Jesus of Nazareth. For Angela, the find is a miracle—a written reference to Jesus outside of the New Testament. But her discovery draws her and her husband, Chris, into a centuries-old race for the truth that they may not win...or survive.

F BERENSON Berenson, Alex. *The secret soldier / G. P. Putnam's Sons*, 2011

CIA operative John Wells goes undercover in Saudi Arabia and Lebanon to find conspirators bent on tearing down the monarchy of King Abdullah. If the conspirators prevail, it will mean more than just the fall of a monarch—it may be the start of a final conflagration between America and the full force of Islam itself.

F BERENSON Berenson, Laurien. *Hounded to death : Kensington Publishing Corp.*, 2007

Melanie Travis, her sister-in-law Bertie and Melanie's Aunt Peg are taking a road trip to a judges' symposium at a Pocono Mountain resort. But the trip takes a sinister turn when Charles Evans, an esteemed judge and animal rights activist who had just delivered a controversial speech calling for an end to dog shows, is found dead in the resort's hot tub.

F BERG Berg, Elizabeth. *Once upon a time, there was you : Random House*, 2011

Sharing nothing in common except their 16-year-old daughter, divorced parents John and Irene reconnect in the wake of a devastating tragedy and discover things about each other that they had not revealed during their marriage.

F BOX Box, C. J. *Cold wind / G. P. Putnam's Sons*, 2011

When Earl Alden is found dead, dangling from a wind turbine, it's his wife, Missy, who is arrested. Unfortunately for Joe Pickett, Missy is his mother-in-law, a woman he dislikes heartily, and now he doesn't know what to do—especially when the early signs point to her being guilty as sin. But then things happen to make Joe wonder: Is Earl's death what it appears to be? Is Missy being set up?

F BOYLE Boyle, T. Coraghessan. *When the killing's done / Viking*, 2011

Traces an incrementally violent confrontation between a National Park Service biologist who would eradicate invasive wildlife on the Channel Islands and two locals who are fiercely opposed to the killing of any creatures.

F BRADLEY Bradley, C. Alan, *A red herring without mustard* / Delacorte Press, 2011

Flavia's discovery of an old Gypsy woman who's been attacked in her wagon sends the girl off on an investigation that will reveal more of Buckshaw's secrets as well as new information about Harriet, the mother Flavia never knew.

F BRIGHTON Brighton, Lori. *Wild heart* / Kensington, 2009

Leo Roberts is next in line for an earldom and the power and fortune that come with it, but he is uncultured, unrefined—and completely untamed. . .until governess Ella Finch arrives upon the scene. Can so young and inexperienced a woman tutor him in the manners and mores of his class? Leo's mysterious past has rendered him an outsider, too wild for polite society. But he finds her innocence most intriguing.

F BRITAIN Britain, Kristen. *Blackveil* / DAW Books, 2011

Legendary Green Rider Karigan G'ladheon—one of the magical messengers of the king—defends her king and fellow riders from an insurrection led by dark magicians that threatens to break the boundaries of ancient, evil Blackveil Forest—releasing powerful dark magics that have been shut away for a millennium.

F BROCKMEIER Brockmeier, Kevin. *The illumination* / Pantheon Books, 2011

In the aftermath of a fatal car accident, a private journal of love notes written by a husband to his wife passes into the keeping of a hospital patient, and from there through the hands of five other suffering people, touching each of them uniquely.

F BROWN Brown, Sandra, *Breath of scandal* / Warner Books, 1991

On a rainy Southern night, Jade Sperry endured a young woman's worst nightmare at the hands of three local hell-raisers. Robbed of her youthful ideals and at the center of scandal and tragedy, Jade ran as far and as fast as she could. But she never forgot the sleepy "company town" where every man, woman, and child was dependent on one wealthy family. And she never forgot their spoiled son, who, with his two friends, changed her life forever. Someday, somehow, she'd return, exact a just revenge—and free herself from fear, and the powerful family that could destroy her.

F BUCHMAN Buchan, Elizabeth. *Separate beds* / Viking, 2011

Hiding the truth about their crumbling marriage beneath a veneer of professional success and domestic security, Tom and Annie Nicholson face more difficulties when the economic crisis causes Tom to lose his job and two family members to move in.

F BUJOLD Bujold, Lois McMaster. *Cryoburn* / Baen Books ; | Distributed by Simon & Schuster, 2010

When a Kibou-daini cryocorp—an immortal company whose job it is to shepherd its all-too-mortal frozen patrons into an unknown future—attempts to expand its franchise

into the Barrayaran Empire, Emperor Gregor dispatches his top troubleshooter Miles Vorkosigan to check it out.

F BUNN Bunn, T. Davis, *The Black Madonna* : Howard Books/Touchstone Books, 2010

Antiques expert Storm Syrrell heads to Europe to investigate the clandestine trade in religious artifacts. Is she prepared to confront both earthly and spiritual powers? She remains haunted by lessons in love and betrayal—but hesitation now holds mortal consequences.

F BURNEY Burney, Fanny, *Evelina ; or, The history of a young lady's entrance into the world* / Oxford University Press, 1968

Leaving the secluded home of her guardian for the first time, beautiful Evelina Anville is captivated by her new surroundings in London's beau monde - and in particular by the handsome, chivalrous Lord Orville. But her enjoyment soon turns to mortification at the hands of her vulgar and capricious grandmother, and the rakish Sir Clement Willoughby, who torments the naive young woman with his unwanted advances. And while her aristocratic father refuses to acknowledge her legitimacy, Evelina can hold no hope of happiness with the man she loves.

F CAIN Cain, Chelsea. *The night season* / Minotaur Books, 2011

River levels are high in Portland when a woman walking her dog comes across the skeleton of a young black man, murdered over fifty years ago. Journalist Susan Ward investigates. Meanwhile, Detective Archie Sheridan and his team have turned their attention to child-killer Ryan Motley, trained by the notorious Gretchen Lowell. The task force must pursue a series of mysterious clues from Gretchen, one of which leads to a Vanport flood survivor, who happens to be the grandfather of a murdered child. Then, when another child is found murdered, Archie's investigation takes on a new urgency.

F CAMILLERI Camilleri, Andrea. *The track of sand* / Penguin Books, 2010

Montalbano wakes from strange dreams to find a gruesomely bludgeoned horse carcass in front of his seaside home. When his men come to investigate, the carcass disappears, leaving only a trail in the sand. Before long, two people report missing horses - Rachele, a champion equestrian, and Lo Duca, one of the richest men in Sicily. Then Montalbano's home is broken into and is ransacked and he is certain that the crimes are linked. As he negotiates the glittering underworld of legitimate horseracing and the Mafia's connection to it, the scrupulous and melancholy Montalbano is aided by his unorthodox methods, melancholy self-reflection, and love of good food—Cover.

F CANNELL Cannell, Dorothy. *Goodbye, Ms. Chips* / St. Martin's Minotaur, 2008

Ellie Haskell is called back to St. Roberta's boarding school by the headmistress, Mrs. Battle, to investigate the theft of the Loverly sports trophy, and finds herself in the midst of a prank that leads to murder.

F CANNELL Cannell, Stephen J. The prostitutes' ball / St. Martin's Press, 2010
Responding to a call at a mansion in the Hollywood Hills, Detective Shane Scully finds three bodies—two women and an acclaimed film producer. Scully and his new partner, Sumner begin investigating which leads to video footage appearing to show an angry husband as the shooter. It seems to be an open and shut case. There's no such thing for Scully.

F CASSELLA Cassella, Carol Wiley. Healer / Simon & Schuster, 2010
Claire Boehning must dust off her long-unused medical expertise and make a living for her family in rural Washington when her husband's biotech venture crashes—taking everything they owned with it.

F CHALLIS Challis, Joanna. Peril at Somner House / Minotaur Books ; | Melia [distributor], 2010
On an island off the coast of Cornwall, Lord Max Trevalyan is found dead of severe head wounds. The many suspects include Trevalyan's widow, her lover, and the gardener, whose daughter gave birth to Max's son. It's up to young future author Daphne du Maurier to find the killer.

F CHAPMAN Chapman, Janet. Tempting the highlander / Pocket Star Books, 2004
Catherine Daniels arrives in Pine Creek, Maine, at just the right time for Robbie MacBain. She is on the run from her ex-husband, and Robbie is a sexy, single foster parent who needs a housekeeper while he travels back in time to medieval Scotland. Unbeknownst to Catherine, Robbie's looking for a book of spells to save the future of his family...and little did he expect to find a burning passion in Catherine's arms. Can Robbie seal his family's fate while enticing Catherine to follow him and her own heart wherever love will take them?

F CHILDS Childs, Laura. Shades of Earl Grey / Berkley Pub., 2003
While at the social event of the year, Theodosia Browning finds herself battling with local police and high society when she starts digging for the real reason behind a groom's freak accident and the bride's missing wedding ring.

F CHILDS Childs, Laura. Death by design / Berkley Prime Crime, 2006
Death by Design brings the first three Scrapbooking mysteries together for the first time! Keepsake Crimes introduces Carmela Bertrand and her booming scrapbooking shop, Memory Mine, on the fringe of New Orleans's French Quarter. When Carmela's estranged husband is named a suspect in a Mardi Gras murder, it is Carmela who must find the clues to the real killer—in one of her customer's scrapbooks. In Photo Finished, Carmela is hosting a late-night "Crop Till You Drop" session at her shop. It's Halloween in New Orleans. Ava and Carmela overhear an argument between Jekyl Hardy and Brett Fowler just minutes before they find Fowler's dead body. After another victim is discovered—who also had an unfriendly relationship with Jekyl—Carmela is convinced someone is framing her friend.

F CHRISTOPHER Christopher, Paul, *The Templar conspiracy* / Signet/New American Library, 2011

"In Rome, the public assassination of the Pope by a sniper on Christmas Day sets off a massive investigation that stretches across the globe. But behind the veil of Rex Deus—the Templar cabal that silently wields power in the twenty-first century—the plot has only just begun. F CLARK Clark, Mary Higgins. *I'll walk alone* / Simon & Schuster, 2011

Struggling with unending heartache for the toddler son who went missing in Central Park two years earlier, interior designer Alexandra is wrongly accused of identity theft and implicated in the murder of a stranger.

F COEL Coel, Margaret, *The spider's web* / Berkley Prime Crime, 2010

When Arapaho Ned Windsong is shot to death, his fiancée Marcy is the only witness. And when the men Marcy has accused of murdering her fiancée found dead in an abandoned barn, Vicky and Father John realize they are caught in a web of lies and deceit woven by a master.

F COLE Cole, Teju. *Open city* : Random House, 2011

Feeling alone and adrift in New York City, Julius sets out on a series of walks, learning much about the people, the city, and especially the city's immigrants. This causes him to probe his own past—a journey that takes him to Europe and the Nigeria of his youth. But, it's only after meeting a young woman from Nigeria that he learns a shattering secret about himself.

F CONLON Conlon, Edward, *Red on red* : Spiegel & Grau, 2011

They were both NYPD detectives, yet they each had radically different approaches to life and work. One was drawn to cases of rough and ordinary combat. The other was compelled by uncanny ghost stories, suicides, and missing persons. Even so, their partnership ultimately altered their view of each other and the world as they knew it.

F CONNELLY Connelly, Michael, *The fifth witness* : Little, Brown, 2011

D.A. Mickey Haller has expanded his business into foreclosure defense, only to see one of his clients accused of killing the banker trying to take away her home. Hoping to

exonerate her, even though his inner voice tells him she's guilty, Mickey mounts the best defense of his career. But, this is one case that's not over when the verdict comes in!

F COONTS Coonts, Stephen, Deep black : St. Martin's Press, 2011

A renegade government and a terrorist cell have gained access to nuclear artillery shells that they intend to detonate in the Canary Islands to cause a massive landslide that will crash on the eastern seaboard. Only Charlie Dean and his team at Desk Three can help avert catastrophe.

F DAVIDSON Davidson, Diane Mott. Crunch time / William Morrow, 2011

Caterer and amateur sleuth-extraordinaire Goldy Schulz digs into a deadly smorgasbord that includes a heaping helping of murder, a double dose of arson ... and nine adorable beagle puppies!

F DAVIS Davis, Krista. The diva runs out of thyme : Berkley Publishing Group, 2008

Few can compete with Natasha Smith when it comes to entertaining, but her childhood rival, Sophie Winston, certainly tries. Natasha may have stolen the spotlight and Sophie's husband but Sophie is determined to rob her of the prize for the Stupendous Stuffing Shakedown. She just needs the right ingredient.

F DONALDSON Donaldson, Stephen R. Against all things ending / G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2010

Linden's defiant act of love—resurrecting Thomas Covenant—awakens the Worm of the World's End. If they have any chance to save the Land, it will come from unlikely sources—including the mysterious boy Jeremiah, Linden's adopted son, whose secrets are only beginning to come to light.

F DUMAURIER Du Maurier, Daphne, My cousin Rachel / Sourcebooks Landmark, 2009

One of the world's great storytellers, Daphne du Maurier spins a dark gothic tale of passion and unswerving love that turns to suspicion and fear. All those adventures—along with one brand new story, written just for this anthology—come bundled in one book thanks to *AMOS WALKER: THE COMPLETE STORY COLLECTION*. This is the collection that this all-American private eye certainly deserves.

F FEIST Feist, Raymond E. *A kingdom besieged* / Harper Voyager, 2011

Midkemia’s most powerful sorcerer Pug faces a major magical cataclysm that forces him to question everything he’s ever held as true and dear ... including the loyalty of his beloved son Magnus.

F FOSTER Foster, Alan Dean, *The human blend* / Del Rey Ballantine Books, 2010

Two genetically altered criminals—Whispr and Jiminy Cricket—murder a random tourist in order to amputate and then fence his sophisticated artificial hand. But the hapless victim also happens to be carrying an unusual silver thread that appears to be some kind of storage medium. When Jiminy disappears, all Whispr wants to do is sell the thread as quickly as he can. When he offers to split the profits with Harvard-educated Dr. Ingrid Seastrom in exchange for her medical services, she makes an astonishing discovery—one that can get them both killed.

F FOSTER Foster, Lori, *Bad boys to go* / Kensington Pub. Corp., 2003

‘Bad Boys To Go’ features three love stories. ‘Bringing Up Baby’ by Lori Foster, ‘The Wilde One’ by Janella Denison, and ‘Going After Adam’, by Nancy Warren.

F FOWLER Fowler, Karen Joy. *The sweetheart season* : Ballantine Books, 1996

As a rebellious daughter of the sixties recalls the year her mother played baseball in 1947, two luminous stories begin to unfold in America’s heartland, one lived and one imagined.

F FOWLER Hale, Benjamin. *The evolution of Bruno Littlemore* / Twelve, 2011

Bruno Littlemore, the world's first chimpanzee with the ability to speak, tells the story of primatologist Lydia Littlemore's efforts to educate him; his untimely outbursts, which ultimately cost Lydia her job; and the unforgettable road trip that follows.

F GOLDENBAUM Goldenbaum, Sally. A holiday yarn : Obsidian, 2010

With the Seaside Knitters' help, Mary Pisano converts her charming inherited home into a B&B. Her first week is booked by her very own family, in town to discuss their grandfather's will. She's hoping the tranquility of the setting will smooth over ill feelings among family members. But when her cousin Pam--a Sea Harbor, Massachusetts, native--is found murdered, she realizes she was dead wrong.

F GOLDMAN Goldman, Francisco. Say her name / Grove Press, 2011

In a novel based on the author's real-life tragedy, Goldman, consumed with grief and guilt over the accidental death of his wife just before their second anniversary, obsessively collects every memory of her, especially her writings, with the hope of keeping her alive in his mind.

F GRASS Grass, Günter, The box : Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2010

Grass writes in the voices of his eight children as they record memories of their childhoods, of growing up, of their father, who was always at work on a new book and at the margins of their lives. Their memories are contradictory, critical, loving, and accusatory. But, the images produced by an old Agfa box camera reveal a truth beyond the ordinary details of life.

F GREEN Green, Simon R., Something from the night side / Ace Books, 2003

John Taylor is not a private detective per se, but he has a knack for finding lost things. That's why he's been hired to descend into the Nightside, an otherworldly realm in the center of London where fantasy and reality share renting space and the sun never shines.

F GREGORIO Gregorio, Michael. Unholy awakening / Minotaur Books, 2010

A woman's body has been found at the bottom of a well. The death wounds are startling: two small, round punctures to the jugular vein. . . . Vampire fever is spreading throughout the countryside, and suspicions soon fall on the recently arrived Emma Rimmele. Investigator Hanno Stiffeniis must do everything he can to find the true culprit before the mob's hysteria reaches its breaking point and turns violent. The chase that follows through the fogs and shallows of the Grand Banks is as tense, and as unexpected in its culmination, as anything Patrick O'Brian has written.

A collaborative effort between W. B. Yeats and resident playwright John Synge at the Abbey Theatre in 1907 gives way to a barrier-breaking affair with teen actress Molly Allgood, who after World War II looks back on her career and the great love of her life.

F OATES Oates, Joyce Carol, *The female of the species* : Harcourt, 2005

A young wife is home alone when the phone rings in "So Help Me God." Is the strange voice flirting with her from the other end of the line her jealous husband laying a trap, or a stranger who knows entirely too much about her? In "Madison at Guignol" an unhappy fashionista discovers a secret door inside her favorite clothing store and insists the staff let her enter. But even her fevered imagination cannot anticipate the

horror they have been hiding from her. In these and other gripping and disturbing tales, women are confronted by the evil around them and surprised by the evil they find within themselves.

F OBREHT Obreht, Téa. *The tiger's wife* : Random House, 2011

Remembering childhood stories her grandfather once told her, young physician Natalia becomes convinced that he spent his last days searching for “the deathless man,” a vagabond who claimed to be immortal. As Natalia struggles to understand why her grandfather, a deeply rational man would go on such a farfetched journey, she stumbles across a clue that leads her to the extraordinary story of the tiger's wife.

F PALAHNIUK Palahniuk, Chuck. *Haunted* : Anchor Books, 2005

“Haunted” is a novel made up of stories: twenty-three of them to be precise. Twenty-three of the most horrifying, hilarious, mind-blowing, stomach-churning tales you'll ever encounter - sometimes all at once. They are told by the people who have all answered the ad headlined ‘Artists Retreat: Abandon your life for three months’. They are led to believe that here they will leave behind all the distractions of ‘real life’ that are keeping them from creating the masterpiece that is in them. But ‘here’ turns out to be a cavernous and ornate old theatre where they are utterly isolated from the outside world - and where heat and power and, most importantly, food are in increasingly short supply. And the more desperate the circumstances become, the more desperate the stories they tell - and the more devious their machinations become to make themselves the hero of the inevitable play/movie/non-fiction blockbuster that will certainly be made from their plight. “Haunted” is at one level a satire of reality television. It draws from a great literary tradition - “The Canterbury Tales”, “The Decameron”, the English storytellers in the Villa Diodati who produced, among other works, “Frankenstein” - to tell an utterly contemporary tale of people desperate that their story be told at any cost. Appallingly entertaining, “Haunted” is Chuck Palahniuk at his finest - which means his most extreme and his most provocative.

F PARKS Parks, Brad, *Eyes of the innocent* / Minotaur Books, 2011

Investigative reporter Carter Ross is working the story of two young boys left home alone and killed in an accidental Newark house fire. The single mother's story of having to work two jobs and being unable to afford childcare sounds plausible, but further checking by Carter reveals she isn't what she seems, and neither is the fire.

F PEARSON Pearson, Allison, *I think I love you* / Alfred A. Knopf, 2011

Pearson captures the hearts and minds of friends Petra and Sharon, both 13, examining the complexity of female friendships; the awakening of sexual desire; the agony and joy of the first crush and first kiss, and the reality of pre-adolescence that's almost too much to bear. Then, some 20 years later, now a divorced mother of a teenager, Petra, realizes a lifelong dream.

F PERRY Perry, Anne. *Treason at Lisson Grove* : Ballantine Books, 2011

Special Branch officer Thomas Pitt, hastening to rendezvous with a secret informant, arrives a second too late, preceded by a knife-wielding assassin. As he pursues the killer and the information he needs to stop a devastating plot against the British government, his clever wife Charlotte heads to Dublin to investigate a case involving Pitt's supervisor, Victor Narraway.

F PHILLIPS Phillips, Michael R., *The eleventh hour* / Tyndale House, 1993

Just before World War II, the Prussian Baron von Dormann and his daughter become uncertain of their future in Germany.

F PICOULT Picoult, Jodi, *Sing you home* : Atria Books, 2011

A stillborn baby ends Max and Zoe's marriage. Max leaves Zoe and turns to drinking. Zoe falls in love with a female school counselor, Vanessa. Max finds help for his drinking problem through his brother's church. Vanessa and Zoe get married. Vanessa offers to carry one of Zoe and Max's fertilized embryos. Zoe goes to Max to get permission to release the embryos to her but Max's new found religious fervor leads him to sue Zoe for custody.

F PITTMAN Pittman, Allison. *With endless sight* : Multnomah, 2008

Born into a life of privilege, fourteen-year-old Belinda never questions her security, even as she leaves Illinois with her family to discover new adventures in the Oregon Territory. But when disaster falls, Belinda is left wounded, weak, and alone. Her faith in God gives her the only strength she knows in a harsh new world.

F QUICK Quick, Amanda. *Quicksilver* / G.P. Putnam's Sons, 2011

"Historical romance novel featuring the Arcane Society, second in The Looking Glass Trilogy"—

F RANKIN Rankin, Ian. *Tooth and nail* / St. Martin's Paperbacks, 1996

Sent to London to help catch a vicious serial killer, Inspector John Rebus teams up with a beautiful psychologist to piece together a portrait of a depraved psychopath bent on painting the town red-with blood.

F RANKIN Rankin, Ian. *Let it bleed* / St. Martin's Paperbacks, 1996

In the dark days and biting windstorms of an Edinburgh winter, two drop-out kids dive off the towering Forth Road Bridge. A civic office is spattered by a grisly gun-blast. F ROZAN Rozan, S. J. On the line / Minotaur Books, 2010
Private investigator Smith is led on a high-stakes goose chase when his occasional partner Lydia Chin is kidnapped. Bill has to stay ahead of the police while he uncovers the kidnapper's identity.

F RUSSELL Russell, Karen, Swamplandia! / Alfred A. Knopf, 2011
Twelve year old Ava must travel into the Underworld part of the swamp in order to save her family's dynasty of Bigtree alligator wrestling. This novel takes us to the swamps of the Florida Everglades, and introduces us to Ava Bigtree, an unforgettable young heroine. The Bigtree alligator wrestling dynasty is in decline, and Swamplandia!, their island home and gator wrestling theme park, formerly no. 1 in the region, is swiftly being encroached upon by a fearsome and sophisticated competitor called the World of Darkness. Ava's mother, the park's indomitable headliner, has just died; her sister, Ossie, has fallen in love with a spooky character known as the Dredgeman, who may or may not be an actual ghost; and her brilliant big brother, Kiwi, who dreams of becoming a scholar, has just defected to the World of Darkness in a last ditch effort to keep their family business from going under.
