Honor Carlisle, a member of the shape-shifter race of the drákon, receives a letter from her future self and learns she is also a time weaver and must leave her home to stay alive, sending Honor on a journey through time on which she meets and falls in love with Alexandru of Zaharen, the prince of a rival clan who is the very person she is supposed to avoid.

Albert, Susan Wittig. The Darling Dahlias and the cucumber tree. 1st ed. New York : Berkley Prime Crime, 2010.

The ladies of the Darling Dahlias garden club investigate a suspicious car wreck, the news of an escaped convict from the prison farm, and a ghost digging around the cucumber tree.

Baer, Robert. Blow the house down : a novel. 1st ed. New York : Crown Publishers, c2006.

CIA officer Max Waller has spent years investigating the abduction and murder of his Agency mentor, and when he finds a photograph of his top suspect standing next to Osama bin Laden, Max becomes suspicious and believes he may have finally uncovered the real reason his mentor was killed.

Hannah, the beautiful Duchess of Dunbarton, freed at the age of thirty by the death of her elderly husband after more than ten years of marriage, announces that she plans to take Constantine, the black sheep of the Huxtable family, as her lover, and while both intended to have only a brief fling, the scandalous union soon turns to love.

Beck, Glenn. The Overton window. 1st Threshold Editions/Mercury Radio Arts hardcover ed. New York : Threshold Editions/Mercury Radio Arts, 2010.

Public relations executive Noah Gardner refuses to help Molly Ross and her group of patriots advance their cause, until an attack on American soil shakes the country to the core and convinces Noah that helping Molly is the most important thing he will ever do, even if it means risking his life.

F BONASIA

Bonasia, Lynn Kiele. Summer shift. 1st Touchstone trade pbk. ed. New York : Simon & Schuster, 2010.

Mary Hopkins, a forty-four-year-old clam bar owner on Cape Cod, feels restless when the summer season starts and a tragic accident rekindles pain from her past, suspicions rise that her beloved great-aunt is falling victim to Alzheimer's diseases, and the long-lost love of her life mysteriously returns to town.

Brashares, Ann. My name is memory. New York : Riverhead Books, 2010.

High school student Lucy is pursued by Daniel, who claims to have known her in a previous life; and as their relationship continues to grow and Lucy begins to recall the secrets of her past, the mysterious force that separated them in their previous lives reappears.

Burke, James Lee, 1936-. The glass rainbow : a Dave Robicheaux novel. 1st Simon & Schuster hardcover ed. New York : Simon & Schuster, 2010.

Detective Dave Robicheaux returns to New Iberia, Louisiana, to investigate the serial murders of seven young women, while he worries about his daughter's relationship with a celebrated novelist who associates with an ex-convict author.

F CABOT

Cabot, Meg. Insatiable. 1st ed. New York : William Morrow, c2010.

Reporter Meena Harper falls in love with vampire Lucien Antonescu, the only man she can see herself having a future with and the first man whose death she cannot predict, but a dangerous group of vampire hunters and her feelings for Lucien threaten to destroy Meena's life.

F CASTILLO

Castillo, Linda. Pray for silence. 1st ed. New York : Minotaur Books, 2010.

Kate Burkholder, the new chief of police in the small community of Painters Mill, Ohio, investigates the brutal murder of an Amish family of seven. When she discovers a diary, she realizes a haunting personal connection to the case and swears she will track down the killer and bring him to justice, even if it means risking her life.

F CITKOWITZ

Citkowitz, Evgenia, 1962-. Ether : seven stories and a novella. 1st ed. New York : Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2010.

A collection of short fiction about people in search of identity.

F CONNOLLY

Connolly, John, 1968-. The whisperers : a Charlie Parker thriller. 1st Atria Books hardcover ed. New York : Atria Books, 2010.

Charlie Parker is called to investigate when the members of a smuggling ring begin dying in apparent suicides and he must outwit the reclusive Herod and his shadowy sidekick, who will stop at nothing to get their hands on an ancient artifact that is bringing evil forces to the region.

Corsi, Jerome R. The Shroud codex. 1st Threshold Editions hardcover ed. New York : Threshold Editions, 2010.

Father Paul Bartholomew, brought back from the dead on the operating table, is haunted by visions when he seems to inhabit the body of Christ on the cross, and when he develops stigmata and physical characteristics that mimic the image on the Shroud of Turin, the Vatican, worried that the case could be proved a hoax, calls upon famous skeptics, New York psychiatrist and atheist Dr. Stephen Castle, and Italian religious researcher Professor Marco Gabrielli, for their opinions.

F CRONIN

Cronin, Justin. The passage : a novel. 1st ed. New York : Ballantine Books, c2010.

FBI agent Brad Wolgast vows to protect six-year-old orphan Amy Harper Bellafonte after a government military experiment she was involved in goes bad, unleashing a toxic virus that turns humans into bloodthirsty monsters.

F DONAHUE

Donahue, Tina. Take my breath away. New York : Brava/Kensington Pub., c2005.

Writer-director Cole Ryder dreads meeting Thaddeus Leigh's niece, Ariel, but he's a visitor on Leigh's Isla de Delicia (Isle of Delight), so there's no escape. But Ariel, much to Cole's surprise, turns out to be a strong, beautiful woman who is able to pilot her own helicopter. As far as Cole can tell, Ariel's major flaw is the fact that she wants to change the script of his movie. In his version, a handsome marine (someone like him) saves a damsel in distress. In her version, a superwoman (someone like her) saves a clueless, stranded politician with her keen survival skills. Finally, Cole agrees to follow her script step-by-step in a real-life, jungle situation to see if her changes would actually work. (Booklist).

In an attempt to save the magical world known as the Land from the evil forces of Lord Foul the Despisier, Thomas Covenant realizes that he must meet Foul alone in combat.

F DURROW

Durrow, Heidi W., 1969-. The girl who fell from the sky : a novel. 1st ed. Chapel Hill, N.C. : Algonquin Books of Chapel Hill, 2010.

Rachael, whose mother is Danish and father is an African-American, loses both her parents and is forced to move to a new city to live with her strict African-American grandmother, but when she is immersed into an African-American community, her physical appearance draws attention and Rachel struggles with her own uncertainties about her identity.

F ELLIS

Ellis, Bret Easton. Imperial bedrooms. 1st ed. New York : Knopf, 2010.

Clay establishes a successful career in screenwriting in New York City and returns to Los Angeles to find a cast for his new movie, but after encounters with old friends and interactions with a very persistent young actress, Clay's inner demons pose a threat to the life he has built.

F FALVEY

Falvey, Patricia. The yellow house : a novel. 1st ed. New York : Center Street, 2010, c2009.

Eileen O'Neill struggles to reunite her family after they are torn apart by death, religious intolerance, and the war for Irish independence, and as her actions and choices change the lives of those around her, Eileen gains a greater understanding of herself and the meaning of faith, love, and loyalty.

F FEI

Fei, Deanna. A thread of sky. New York : Penguin Press, 2010.

After her husband of thirty years is killed in an accident, Irene Shen takes her three daughters on a trip across mainland China, which they fled for the United States long ago, and attempts to heal her fractured family by reconnecting with her poet sister and eighty-year-old mother, uncovering secrets about each other and finding relationships tested along the way.

F FRANK

Frank, Dorothea Benton. Lowcountry summer. 1st ed. New York : William Morrow, c2010.

Caroline Wimbley Levine never expected to assume the role of her late mother, a force of nature who ruled Tall Pines Plantation in South Carolina's Lowcountry, but with her son taking up with an older single mom, her sister-in-law indulging in alcoholic binges, her brother in love with another woman, and her nieces behaving like heathens, she knows someone has to take control.

F GARDINER

Gardiner, Meg. The liar's lullaby. New York : Dutton, c2010.

San Francisco forensic psychiatrist Jo Beckett investigates the shooting death of the president's ex-wife, whose controversial country song had recently made headlines, and questions if the singer killed herself or was murdered by supporters of her ex-husband.

F GARDNER

Gardner, Lisa. Live to tell : a detective D.D. Warren novel. 1st ed. New York : Bantam Books, c2010.

Veteran police detective D. D. Warren, investigating the apparent murder-suicide of four members of a Boston family, meets Danielle Burton, a dedicated nurse whose past haunts her, and Victoria Oliver, a mother who will do anything for her troubled son, and the lives of the three women unexpectedly become connected.

F GOODMAN

Goodman, Allegra. The cookbook collector : a novel. 1st ed. New York : Dial Press, c2010.

Sisters Emily and Jessamine Bach are close even though they are very different, with Emily running a successful dot.com business and Jess working in an antiquarian bookstore, but their lives begin to converge when issues of love and loyalty come into play.

F GOODWILLIE

Goodwillie, David, 1972-. American subversive : a novel. 1st Scribner hardcover ed. New York : Scribner, 2010.

When a bomb devastates an office tower in New York City, Aidan Cole and his young professional friends attempt to make sense of the event and determine its connection to a young woman named Paige Roderick.

F HAINES

Haines, Carolyn. Bone appétit. 1st ed. New York : Minotaur Books, 2010.

Private investigator Sarah Booth, on vacation with her friend and business partner Tinkie and trying to overcome her recent miscarriage, is drawn into the investigation of threats at a beauty pageant of which the leading contestants have been the targets.

F HIAASEN

Hiaasen, Carl. Star Island. 1st ed. New York : Knopf, 2010.

When Ann DeLusia—a “stunt double” for pop star Cherry Pye whenever Cherry is too indisposed to be seen in public—is kidnapped by an obsessed paparazzo from a hotel in South Beach, Cherry’s record producer, publicist, and others attempt to rescue Ann while keeping the ordeal a secret.

F HILDERBRAND

Hilderbrand, Elin. The island : a novel. 1st ed. New York : Little, Brown and Co., 2010.

Birdie Cousins’ planned trip to Tuckernuck Island off the coast of Nantucket with her daughter Chess before her upcoming marriage takes a different turn when Chess suddenly breaks her engagement and her fiancé dies in a rock-climbing accident.

F HOFFMAN

Hoffman, Paul, 1953-. The left hand of God. New York : Dutton, c2010.

Thomas Cale, a prisoner in the Sanctuary of the Redeemers since childhood, discovers a plot to wage a holy war and attempts a daring escape; but as the only one able to save the world, the Redeemers cannot afford to let them run loose.

F HOOPER

Hooper, Kay. Rebel waltz. Bantam mass market ed. New York : Bantam Books, 2009, c1986.

Banner Clairmont is forced to sell Jasmine Hall, an antebellum plantation that had been in her family for generations, but she is hesitant about real estate speculator Rory Stewart after he witnesses the ghosts that have never before appeared to strangers.

F HOOPER

Hooper, Kay. Whisper of evil. New York : Bantam Books, 2002.

Nell Gallagher, forced by family duty to return to Silence over a decade after she left, finds the little town in the grip of terror over a killer who has already claimed three victims, and she must use the psychic skills that drove her away in an effort to find answers.

F HOOPER

Hooper, Kay. Out of the shadows. New York : Bantam Books, 2000.

To catch this killer, she must break every rule and cross every line.

F HOOPER

Hooper, Kay. Hunting fear. Bantam mass market ed. New York : Bantam Books, 2005, c2004.

Psychic investigator Lucas Jordan, sought after by police throughout the nation for his ability to locate missing people, responds to what seems to be a routine string of kidnappings and finds himself targeted by a ruthless adversary.

Isaacs, Susan, 1943-. As husbands go : a novel. 1st Scribner hardcover ed. New York : Scribner, 2010.

Susie B. Anthony Rabinowitz Gersten, thinking her marriage to a Park Avenue plastic surgeon is perfect, is surprised when he is found dead with an escort and sets out to prove her husband was not an adulterer and uncover who the killer is.

F JACKSON

Jackson, Joshilyn. Backseat saints. 1st ed. New York : Grand Central Pub., 2010.

Rose Mae Lolley, having been told by a gypsy that her abusive husband will kill her, sets out in search of an ex-boyfriend, who once offered to murder her alcoholic father, with the intention of convincing him to kill her spouse, but instead Rose is forced to face her situation head on as well as deal with her feelings over being abandoned as a child by her mother.

F JACOBS LP

Jacobs, Anna. *Kirsty's vineyard*. Leicester : Charnwood, 2008.

Lonely widow Kirsty has put her life on hold for four years but when she meets elderly and ill Ed James a friendship blossoms. Upon Ed's death she is shocked to discover that he has left her his money and Australian vineyard with one condition—that she lives there for at least one year.

F JOHANSEN

Johansen, Iris. *Shadow zone*. 1st ed. New York : St. Martin's Press, 2010.

Submersible designer Hannah Bryson makes a shocking discovery while mapping the ancient underwater city of Marinth that could have devastating consequences for the modern-day world, and when her key artifact is stolen on the way to the research laboratory, she is thrust into a life-threatening battle of wits against a terrifying enemy.

Kennedy, A. L. *What becomes : stories*. 1st U.S. ed. New York : Alfred A. Knopf, 2010, c2009.

A collection of twelve short fiction stories by British author A. L. Kennedy.

F KENT

Kent, Alexander. *Man of war*. 1st ed. Ithaca, NY : McBooks Press, c2003.

Adam Bolitho is appointed captain of the seventy-four gun Royal Navy ship "Athena," and travels to the Caribbean, where he confronts a man who is involved in human trafficking.

F KENT

Kent, Alexander. *Second to none*. Ithaca, N.Y. : Chicago, Ill. : McBooks Press ; Distributed by LPC Group, 2001.

June 1815: Set on the eve of Waterloo, *Second to None* is the latest addition to the long chronicle of Richard Bolitho and the opening of its second age. Battling pirates and slavers, Captain Adam Bolitho of the *Unrivalled* stands alone at the dawn of a new era in history, poised to take up the duty and courage which are his legacy.

March 1811: War with Britain's former American colony looms on the horizon. Supported by his loyal men, Bolitho must use all his ingenuity to defeat one of America's great naval commanders, Nathan Beer. Impatient to be home, Bolitho decides yet again that the boldest measures are best, and proves to the army that brave men do not die in vain. But there is little respite. After a defiant, all-too-brief

reunion with his mistress, Lady Catherine Somervell, Bolitho undertakes a secret mission to Denmark, which nearly ends in disaster and further damages his sight. When diplomacy fails, he is eager to quit the land and joins the expedition to bombard Copenhagen in a new flagship, Black Prince.

Beneath the hostile mortars of La Guaira lies the ultimate prize: Her Catholic Majesty's largest treasure ship, laden with gold and silver bound for Spain. Larsson, Stieg, 1954-2004. The girl who played with fire. 1st Vintage Crime/Black Lizard ed. New York : Vintage Books, 2010, c2009.

Mikael Blomkvist is publishing the story of his career, exposing the extensive sex trafficking operation between Sweden and Eastern Europe, but when two investigative journalists are killed the night before the story runs and Lisbeth Salander is implicated, Mikael vows to clear the girl's name and find the true killer.

F LEVY

Levy, Andrea, 1956-. The long song. 1st American ed. New York : Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2010.

The author draws upon the history of the 1832 slave rebellion in Jamaica to tell the story of July, a young slave girl, who is taken in as a house servant by her British overseer and subsequently abused.

F LEWIS

Lewis, Beverly, 1949-. The telling. Minneapolis : Bethany House, c2010.

Grace Byler leaves her Amish community with her new English friend to search for her estranged mother in Ohio; meanwhile, Grace's mother, Lettie, continues her own quest to find what she feels is missing and swallows her guilt over leaving her family.

F LITTLEFIELD

Littlefield, Sophie. A bad day for pretty. 1st ed. New York : Minotaur Books, 2010.

Stella Hardesty, having promised Neb Donovan's wife that she will clear her husband's name in the murder of a woman whose body was found in a foundation he poured, searches for clues about the real murderer, while also dealing with the arrival of her boyfriend Sheriff "Goat" Jones's ex-wife.

F MADDEN

Madden, Deirdre, 1960-. Molly Fox's birthday. 1st U.S. ed. New York : Picador, 2010, c2008.

A nameless woman reflects on her twenty-year friendship with renowned actress Molly Fox while staying at Molly's Dublin home, and as she looks back on their life together, she wonders if she ever really knew Molly, or herself.

F MAGEE

Magee, Doug, 1947-. Never wave goodbye : a novel of suspense. 1st Touchstone hardcover ed. New York : Simon & Schuster, 2010.

Lena Trainor puts her daughter on a bus to sleep-away camp for two weeks, then sets about trying to repair her troubled marriage; but when a second bus arrives to pick up Sarah, it becomes apparent that she and three other children have been kidnapped and the police suspect one or more of the parents.

F MALLADI

Malladi, Amulya. A breath of fresh air. 1st trade pbk. ed. New York : Ballantine Books, 2003, c2002.

In 1984 in Bhopal, India, Anjali's marriage to her army officer husband fails. Years later, after she has remarried, her first husband suddenly reappears in her life, and she is forced to reconcile her roles of wife, ex-wife, working woman, and mother.

F MARGOLIN

Margolin, Phillip. Supreme justice : a novel of suspense. 1st ed. New York : Harper, c2010.

Dana Cutler is called in to investigate when the attack of one Supreme Court justice and the unexpected retirement of another seem to be linked to Sarah Woodruff, a convict on death row who submitted her appeal to the court just as the seats became vacant, and Dana soon uncovers a surprising link between Sarah's alleged victim and a powerful United States intelligence agency.

F MCGOVERN

McGovern, Cammie. Neighborhood watch : a novel. New York : Viking, 2010.

After twelve years in prison for a crime she did not commit, Betsy Treading discovers that the court of popular opinion is still against her and she sets out to find the real killer.

F MORAIS

Morais, Richard C., 1960-. The hundred-foot journey : a novel. 1st Scribner hardcover ed. New York : Scribner, 2010.

Hassan Haji and his family are forced to leave their home and restaurant in Mumbai and try to reestablish their lives in a small village in the French Alps, but their inexpensive Indian cuisine becomes unwanted competition for a locally renowned chef, Madame Mallory.

F NICHOLLS

Nicholls, David, 1966-. One day. 1st Vintage Contemporaries ed. New York : Vintage Contemporaries, 2010, c2009.

The single day that Dexter Mayhew and Emma Morley spend together in 1988, the day after college graduation in Edinburgh, makes a distinct impression on each of them and a relationship forms only after they part ways and are reunited once a year on the same day for twenty years.

F OLIVEIRA

Oliveira, Robin. My name is Mary Sutter. New York : Viking, 2010.

Twenty-year-old Mary Sutter, a midwife who dreams of becoming a surgeon, leaves her home in Albany, New York, and travels to Washington, D.C., where she is taken on as an assistant to chief surgeon William Stipp at a Union hospital, and earns his admiration and love.

F PERKINS-VALDEZ

Perkins-Valdez, Dolen. Wench : a novel. 1st ed. New York : Amistad, c2010.

Lizzie, Reenie, and Sweet, three enslaved African-American mistresses who are regularly brought to a resort called the Tawawa House prior to the Civil War, contemplate running for freedom after a fire sets off a series of tragedies.

F PILCHER

Pilcher, Robin. The long way home. 1st U.S. ed. New York : Thomas Dunne Books/St. Martin's Press, 2010.

Claire Barclay and her husband Art fly to Scotland to care for Claire's stepfather Leo after he has a stroke, and when Leo refuses to leave his beloved home, Art comes up with a plan to buy the estate and turn it into a conference center, but when Claire learns another offer has been made for the property, her suspicions turn toward Leo's confidant and her former lover, Jonas Fairweather.

F POUNCEY

Pouncey, Maggie. Perfect reader. 1st ed. New York : Pantheon Books, c2010.

Flora Dempsey returns home to discover her father, a famous literary critic and former college president who has recently died, left behind a series of unpublished poems written to a girlfriend Flora did not know existed, and as she tries to come to terms with his death, the girlfriend who wants to befriend Flora, and her own unsettled feelings about her childhood, Flora learns some surprising truths about who she is and what she wants out of life.

F PRONZINI

Pronzini, Bill. Betrayers : a Nameless Detective novel. 1st ed. New York : Forge, 2010.
